



**SECTION 3000 - STUDENTS
HEALTH EDUCATION**

For student learning outcomes in the MB Health Curriculum, related to potentially sensitive issues, schools must seek parental involvement and provide a delivery option prior to implementation.

Parental Involvement:

The form letter is to be sent the first week of school to the parent/guardian of each Lord Selkirk School Division student, to be signed and returned to the student's school by September 30th .

Some of the content and issues pertaining to student learning outcomes may be potentially sensitive for some students and their parents/families and/or communities based on religious and/or cultural values.

Lord Selkirk School Division will provide an alternative delivery choice for those parents who opt out of the school-based program:

- If the school-based program delivery is rejected by parent/guardian, it will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian to instruct their child based on the Manitoba Health curriculum.
- Evaluation of performance on the alternative delivery model will be based upon the same benchmarks and rubric as used in the school based program. Date of evaluation will be set by classroom teacher.

School Involvement:

Schools in Lord Selkirk School Division will provide information resources, outlining the Health curriculum for each grade. A

A syllabus of each teacher's Health program will be available upon request from the school.
